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Philippians 3:2-3, 15-21 (ESV)

2 <u>Look out for the dogs, look out for the evildoers, look out for those who mutilate the flesh</u>. 3 For we are the circumcision, who worship by the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh....

15 Let those of us who are mature think this way, and if in anything you think otherwise, God will reveal that also to you. 16 Only let us hold true to what we have attained. 17 Brothers, join in imitating me, and keep your eyes on those who walk according to the example you have in us. 18 For many, of whom I have often told you and now tell you even with tears, walk as enemies of the cross of Christ. 19 Their end is destruction, their god is their belly, and they glory in their shame, with minds set on earthly things. 20 But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, 21 who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself.

The Importance of Doctrine

- Acts 2:42 The early church <u>devoted</u> itself to the apostle's doctrine.
- Ephesians 4:1-16 Doctrine is the basis of unity and stability in the Church. (next two slides)
- ◆ 1 Timothy 3:13-16 Doctrinal teaching must be the focus of <u>pastoral</u> ministry.
- 2 Timothy 4:3 In the church of the last days, people will not tolerate strong doctrine.

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Ephesians 4:1-16

I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call—one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all....

And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry...

Ephesians 4:1-16 (cont.)

...for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.

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The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Nicene Creed (381; Part A)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, visible and invisible.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

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The Nicene Creed (381; Part B)

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father [and the Son],† who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

What Evangelical Christians Believe?

- The <u>Trinity/Triunity</u> of Father, Son & Spirit.
- The Full Deity & Humanity of Christ.
- The <u>Atoning</u> Value of Christ's Death.
- The **Bodily Resurrection** of Christ.
- Salvation by <u>Faith</u> (apart from <u>Works</u> of merit).
- Need for A <u>Personal</u> Relationship with God.
- Priesthood of Believers.
- The <u>Second Coming</u> of Christ.
- Inspiration and Authority of God's Word.

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Characteristics of False Teachers

- False teachers vary on doctrines significant to <u>salvation</u> – e.g., Trinity, deity of Christ, salvation by grace through faith, atonement.
- They prey on the <u>untaught</u> and <u>unaware</u>.
- They focus on <u>externals</u> "earthly things."
- They use covert and secretive methods.
- They often appear <u>harmless</u> (moral, include some truth in their message).
- They cause <u>divisions</u> in the body of Christ.
- Their teaching results in <u>damnation</u>.

Warning Signs of Cults (Rose)

- A leader who claims to be divinely inspired.
- <u>Extra-biblical</u> revelation (written or oral) or an authoritative interpretation of the Bible.
- Rejection of other <u>churches</u>.
- Control over members' activities and friendships.
- Brain-washing techniques (e.g., sleep deprivation).

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Warning Signs of Cults (Rose; cont.)

- Over-powering demonstrations of love.
- Control over finances and financial decisions.
- No personal <u>privacy</u> (yet private meetings).
- Leadership that will not tolerate honest questions.
 - No accountability in leadership structure.
 - No checks-and-balances.

Principles for a Godly Response

- Expose false teachers as <u>enemies</u> of <u>Christ</u> without hesitation or compromise.
 - Yet, don't overstate the case be concise.
- Do not allow them to <u>infiltrate</u> the Body.
- Engage them strongly and contend for the integrity of the Gospel.
- Warn believers with the strongest words shake them from their complacency.
- ◆ Teach <u>strong doctrine</u> take the offensive.
- Challenge every believer to take <u>responsibility</u> for their own growth in Christ.

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What Every Christian Should <u>Know</u> After Attending Church 5 Years:

- Assurance of salvation.
- Basic principles of Christian walk and worship.
- Overall scheme and story of the <u>Bible</u>.
- Basic doctrines of the faith foundations.
- Principles for <u>reading/interpreting</u> the Bible.
- Essential purposes of our <u>individual lives</u>.
- Essential purposes and story of the <u>Church</u>.

What Every Christian Should <u>Be Able to Do</u> After Attending Church 5 Years:

- Read the Bible for themselves with profit.
- Have an <u>effective</u> quiet time with God.
- <u>Lead</u> someone to <u>faith</u> in Christ.
- <u>Disciple</u> someone in basic principles and practices of the faith.
- Use <u>spiritual gifts</u> in service to the Body of Christ.
- Live a holy life and be filled with the Spirit.
- Live a life of <u>stewardship</u> before God (3 T's).
- Apply Biblical principles to life's issues & problems.

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What Every Christian Should <u>Be Like</u> After Attending Church 5 Years:

- Evidencing the Fruit of the Spirit (Gal.5:22-24;
 Eph.5:9 "fruit of the light").
- Growing in Christ-like Character (Eph.4:13; 2 Cor. 3:18).
- "Partaking of the Divine Nature" (2 Pet.1:3-11; climbing the ladder of virtue; "moral advance")
- Demonstrating Love of God and Neighbor through Obedience, Compassion, Pursuit of Justice, and Good Works (1 Jn. 3-4)
- Summary: Being Renewed in the Image of God.

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What May Happen

- If the Body hears you, you will <u>save</u> the flock from danger.
- You may save some who are <u>tempted</u> from being led astray.
- If any within your flock succumb, they must be exposed and disciplined.
 - To prevent the leaven from spreading.
 - To warn others who are tempted.
