Good News from the Campus Christian Center (C3)!



In 2012, we opened the Campus Christian Center (C3) as a home for 20+ Christian ministries at Arizona State University in Tempe. This was the fulfillment of a vision the Lord gave us in 1981 when we were ASU students! After leasing for three years, our ministry, Community Ministries Inter-

national (CMI), purchased the facility in 2015. Just six

years later, in 2021, the mortgage was fully paid off, thanks to God's abundant provision through his generous people! To date, \$1.7 million has been given to the C3 capital fund, which is 90% of our goal! Praise God! This past year — C3's 10th Anniversary — has been one of building renewal: five new HVAC units, a new



main sewer line, and extensive remodeling of the 97-year-old Hiebert House at the front of the property, including construction of Eden Tea & Coffee House. Our colleague Amie Pierone

Family Matters... We are grateful for the gift of family! In May, we celebrated our 39th anniversary. We first met in 1980 at a student prayer meeting at Quo Vadis Books next to ASU. (QV is now next to C3!) Life and ministry have been connected for us ever since. A special blessing in April was hiking the Grand Canyon with our daughter, Rebekah, celebrating that Sarah



has been cancer free for four years! We were also blessed to be at the University of Oxford for ten days in July serving as volunteer staff for the C.S.



Lewis Foundation's Summer Institute. In October, we celebrated the 101st birthday of Ben's Mom, Virginia, and Rebekah's 30-something birthday (pictured with Ben's brother, Randy, at the Desert Botanical Garden in Phoenix). Later in October, Sarah's sister, Melody, moved in with us while she transitions back to Tempe. It's good to be together!



After starting the Arizona Center for Christian Studies (AzCCS; www.azccs.net) in 2011, Ben has organized major events at ASU featuring outstanding Christian scholars and scientists, such as Professors Colin Humphreys, N.T. Wright, Ted Davis, John Len-



nox, Deborah Haarsma, William Newsome, and Michael Reiss. In 2019, with a \$25,000 grant from Fuller Seminary, Ben and his team hosted the Conference On

Faith And Science (COFAS) at ASU. With 12 leading Christians in science from across the U.S., Canada, and U.K. as speakers, this conference was attended by 250 students, professors, and community members. Following the success of this first COFAS, the John Templeton Foundation awarded a \$230,000 grant to AzCCS in 2020, with half of the grant for AzCCS to host two Christian-focused COFAS conferences and the other half subcontracted by AzCCS to ASU to host two multi-faith Conferences on Religion, Ethics, and Science (CORES). Ben's



extraordinary co-workers were Misty Falkner, Assistant Director of AzCCS, and Dr. Barry Ritchie, ASU Professor of Physics, along with amazing faculty teams. Because of COVID-19, we shifted from in-person to virtual events, beginning in September 2020 with a Zoom con-FAITH&SCIENCE versation between Rabbi Jonathan Sacks in London and four ASU professors, which was watched by over 400 people. In February 2021 (online only) and February 2022 (online and in person at ASU), CORES and COFAS conferences were hosted with 2,200 participants from 43 states of the U.S. and 36 other nations. Remarkably, almost 70 professors from around

the world were in conversations with 60 faculty members from ASU and other Arizona universities. For more information, visit csrc.asu.edu/cores, www.COFASasu.org, and www.fb.com/cofas.asu. The final CORES event will be on January 26, 2023, at 12 p.m. MST, with a program on "Let There Be Light': Religion and the Birth of Modern Science." Further, Ben is discussing with the Veritas Forum the possibility of hosting Oxford Professor John Lennox at ASU in April 2023. 
